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Allina Health grants \$1,000 to support Pierce County dental program

Services provided to uninsured, low-income residents

RIVER FALLS, Wis. (March 25, 2013) — Allina Health recently made a \$1,000 contribution to the Pierce County Public Health Department. The funds were designated to support the health department's new partnership with Southside Community Health Services, a Minneapolis-based nonprofit that will provide dental services to uninsured, low-income residents of the county.

"Southside is a federally qualified health center with a mobile dental van," explained Sue Galoff, Director of the Pierce County Health Department. "The grant from Allina Health will help cover the cost of getting the van to Pierce County."

Galoff went on to explain that the van will provide services not only patients with BadgerCare, who often struggle to find a dental provider, but also those without any dental insurance at all. Southside provides services on a sliding fee scale, meaning that those with the least income are charged the least.

"We know that oral health is a key component of overall health," said Heather Logelin, Allina Health's Director of Community Engagement in Western Wisconsin. "We are pleased to support this new partnership, improving access to dental services for uninsured and low-income individuals in our region."

The \$1,000 contribution was funded through Allina's charitable contributions program, which provides support to organizations working to meet the needs of the communities we serve, and was recommended by a committee of River Falls Area Hospital employees.
